Ella Tyran, Viennese-born soprano, studied at the Vienna Conservatory. Master classes led her to Patricia Wise, Raul Gimenez and Mirella Freni. Ms. Tyran is the winner of the Nico Dostal Competition, of the contest *Classic Mania* and prize winner of the International Singing Competition Ferruccio Tagliavini a.s.o.

Ms. Tyran was a member of the ensemble at the Staatstheater am Gärtnerplatz in Münich, where she performed as Madeline in "The Fall of the House of Usher" by Philip Glass, Adele in J. Strauß "Die Fledermaus", Edronica in "Der Geduldige Sokrates" by Telemann, Elvira in "Italiana in Algeri" by Rossini, Micaela in Bizet's "Carmen", Nanetta in "Falstaff" by Verdi.

Other guest contracts led Ms. Tyran to the Teatro Pergolesi, Theater Koblenz, Opera Cluj, Opera Tampa Florida and other houses in China and Japan.

Her repertoire encludes Mimi and Musetta in La Boheme, Liu in Turandot, Nedda in I Pagliacci, Micaela in Carmen. In concert she lately sang Donna Elvira in Mozarts Don Giovanni and Leonora in Verdi's Il Trovatore.
