

Roman Mogilevskiy

Roman Mogilevskiy was born into a family of professional musicians. With a pianist as a mother and a conducting professor as an uncle, his path was set at a young age. He enjoyed his training as a conductor at the Vienna Conservatory with Prof. Maximilian Cencic, which he completed with distinction. He also studied the “Viennese” conducting style with Professor Kurt Schmid.

In 2014 he was awarded first prize in the conducting competition as part of the Vienna Music Seminar, and was also awarded the first orchestra prize by the Savaria Symphony Orchestra, Hungary. 2013-2019 Roman Mogilevskiy conducts the annual performance of the oratorio "Ode to Life" by Kurt Schmid and the concerts in the Minoritenkirche on the national holiday.

In 2018 he was an assistant professor in the master class of Prof. Johannes Wildner, professor at the University of Music and Performing Arts Vienna, as part of the Vienna Conducting Course Music Seminar.

2017-2022 Regular member of the jury of the Prof. Dichler Competition as part of the Vienna Music Seminar.

In 2019, Roman Mogilevskiy celebrated great success with the Vienna Hofburg Orchestra with concerts in the Vienna State Opera and the Vienna Konzerthaus, among others.

In January 2020 he had a concert tour with the Vienna Strauss Symphony Orchestra with “New Year’s Concerts” in Germany with a Viennese program.
